Duke of Edinburgh - On July 13th and 14th this year a group of 18 pupils from Year 10 undertook their Bronze DofE expedition in North Wales. The pupils were absolutely outstanding and were a real credit to the school and their families. The expedition involved two days of walking using a range of navigational skills as



well as an overnight camp where pupils had to cook their own meals. All 18 pupils passed the expedition and have now completed their Bronze DofE Award and are ready and raring to start their Silver Award in September.

LONDON ORCHESTRA TRIP - During this academic year, a group of pupils across Year 7 to 10 have been taking part in weekly rehearsals as part of a Modulo orchestra. They have also taken part in several workshops with the BBC Philharmonic Orchestra and performed alongside pupils from across the North West of England. On Friday 12th July the group travelled to London where they performed alongside pupils from across



the UK at the Royal Academy of Music. The pupils performed pieces including Pasttime with Good Company by Henry VIII, Coro di Zingari e Conzone (the Anvil Chorus) by Verdi and Say a Little Prayer by Bacharach. All of those involved have been an absolute credit to the school and are becoming competent musicians. A big thanks goes out to Miss Taylor and Mr McDonnell for supporting the trip.
