History

BLACK HISTORY MONTH

During the month of October, the history department celebrated 'Black History Month'. In PDC lessons pupils learnt that **black history is fundamental to understanding British history because it is a fundamental part of British history.**

This was brought home to pupils as they discovered the story of Charles Wotten, a black sailor killed in the Liverpool race riots of 1919.

This was followed up in history lessons as pupils discussed and debated the presence of black people in the UK from earliest times with reference to 'Cheddar man', the Black Romans stationed at Hadrian's Wall and Ignatius Sancho, the first black person to vote in Britain.

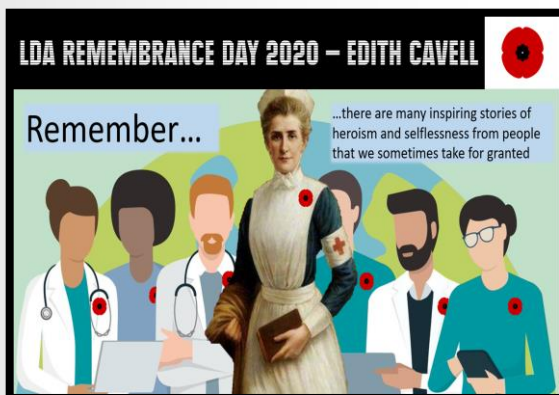

REMEMBRANCE DAY

Like many events this year, Remembrance Day has been greatly affected by the coronavirus outbreak. It was therefore fitting that the focus of remembrance this year at LDA was a nurse who made the ultimate sacrifice during World War One.

Edith Cavell not only nursed soldiers (both British and German) during the war but also smuggled Allied soldiers out of Belgium to safety.

Her actions were eventually discovered and she was executed by firing squad. Some of her last words were **"Patriotism is not enough; I must have no hatred or bitterness to anyone."**

The history department has recently launched a new project for KS3 pupils – **Meanwhile, elsewhere...** For homework pupils have been tasked with researching an event that took place at the same time (meanwhile) as the British history they are studying in class but in another location (elsewhere). We look forward to seeing some amazing presentations – This half term the focus is on the Song Dynasty (Year 7), the formation of Jamestown in America (Year 8) and the creation of the League of Nations (Year 9).

OUR NEXT STEPS TO SUCCESS

Ensuring our pupils have been able to access a range of excellent resources we have developed a set of resources that is an extension to our classroom. Every pupil from Year 7 to 11 has their own classroom with specifically chosen resources to support learning in the classroom.

Alongside this, for Year 11, we have utilised an excellent set of resources from an online academy. Oak National Academy has been recognised for its online content, so it only felt appropriate that we used these for our pupils. Me and the rest of the geography team have posted work online that pupils can link over to the website and watch 20 minute lessons taught by teachers and even complete some activities.

GEOGRAPHY IN THE NEWS

Last week saw the Phillipian island of Catanduanes being hit by super typhoon Goni. Reports suggest that 90% of the region has either been directly effected or destroyed because of this tropical storm. It is believed to be the worst storm to hit the country since Typhoon Haiyan in 2013. This particular typhoon is studied by our GCSE pupils to support their understanding of weather hazards. Goni is believed to have created a storm surge effecting many coastal communities, power supplies have been cut and there are even reports of evacuation centres having their roofs torn off.



GEOGRAPHY CURRICULUM

- Over the next half term, pupils in Year 7, 8 and 9 will be studying the topics listed below. It is important that pupils log on to their google classroom to access the wealth of resources that have been created.
