Headteacher Message

Dear Parent/Carer

I hope that you and your families are safe and well.

We have had a significant number of pupils needing to self-isolate this week as a result of a relatively small number of positive cases of COVID-19 within year groups. We will always put Health and Safety first and it is crucial that we internally track any possible close contacts of a pupil who tests positive and ask these contacts to stay at home. This decision is never taken lightly but it is an action that could help to break any possible transmission of the virus. I truly thank you as parents/carers for all your support in this matter. Any child isolating at home is provided with appropriate work, aligned to the curriculum, via Google Classroom and Class Charts and we have also been able to offer a number of 'live lessons' to Key Stage 4 pupils. As mentioned last week, please do not hesitate to contact the school if your child is struggling to access the work from home for any reason (including a lack of an electronic device) and we will do all we can to support.

I am pleased to report that our Year 11 cohort have begun their GCSE mock examinations and their attitudes to learning have been exemplary. Over the last two weeks every pupil at Lord Derby Academy has been given access to Tassomai which is a fantastic online learning resource. Tassomai is an intelligent learning program that quizzes pupils on their knowledge across the three core subjects; English, maths and science. The exciting feature is that the program gets to know each pupil individually and tailors its quizzes to focus on any gaps in knowledge while probing deeper into the topics they are familiar with. It is a user-friendly way to develop and deepen knowledge and understanding to achieve outstanding progress.

The expectation is that every pupil must register and complete a minimum of 4 daily goals per week but the more they do, the better progress they can achieve and there is no limit to the number of quizzes they can take. Their success is shown on a personal tree of knowledge and they can feel very proud of their achievements as the tree grows and becomes full of green leaves. 


Duke of Edinburgh Award

LDA will be experiencing our very first virtual Book Fair next week!


