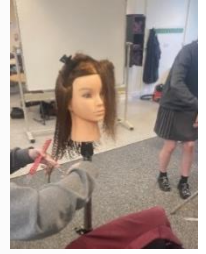

Year 9 Widening Participation & Education Pathways – Interactive Theatre Presentation

Year 9 were fortunate to attend an engaging 1-hour theatre presentation and integrated workshop, looking at options for future routes and how these can lead to a fulfilling future for all.

The show was an informative and fun introduction to Post 16 & 18 pathways, focusing on the different options available (including different routes to higher education and widening participation) and the importance of planning for a successful future. The programme was designed to raise aspirations and motivate our pupils in order for them to plan for, and achieve, the highest level they can in education and training, regardless of their background. It also examined the importance of GCSEs, Post-16 options, Post-18 options and staying on in education until 18.

Ramadan

During the month of Ramadan, Muslims will not eat or drink during the hours of daylight. This is called fasting. Children are not expected to fast until they reach puberty, usually around the age of 14.

Ramadan remembers the month the Qur'an (the Muslim holy book) was first revealed to the Prophet Muhammad. The actual night that the Qur'an was revealed is a night known as Lailat ul-Qadr ('The Night of Power').

When is Ramadan?

Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. The exact dates of Ramadan change every year. This is because Islam uses a calendar based on the cycles of the Moon.

In 2022 in the UK, Ramadan will begin in the evening of Saturday 2 April and will end on Sunday 1 May.

Ramadan starts when the new Moon first appears in the night sky. Full moon marks the middle of Ramadan. As the Moon wanes to the other side, Ramadan finishes.

How is Ramadan celebrated?

Most Muslims fast between dawn and sunset. Fasting allows Muslims to devote themselves to their faith. It is thought to teach self-discipline and reminds them of the suffering of the poor. However, children, pregnant women, elderly people and those who are ill or travelling do not have to fast.

During Ramadan, it is common to have one meal (known as the suhoor), just before dawn and another (known as the iftar), directly after sunset.

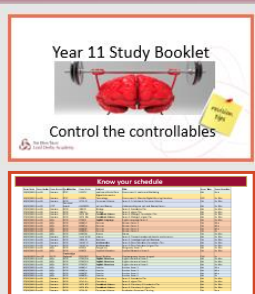
On our return from the Easter break the following practical examinations are taking place:
