

LDA Summer School 2022

During the summer break we held our LDA Summer School 2022, welcoming our new Year 7 pupils to Lord Derby Academy. The aim of the week was to ensure the smooth transition of all pupils from primary into secondary education. To support the academic and pastoral elements of Transition we were able to deliver a bespoke timetable of events including mathematics, science, literacy and sport.

We welcomed on average 150 plus pupils each day, enabling pupils to establish new friendships for the new academic year. Pupils took part in a variety of activities including: dodgeball, code breaking, 'Where am I?', extracting DNA, inventing fantastic stories, creating short performances and learning basic first aid.

During summer school, we were fortunate to work alongside Liverpool Football Club who delivered basic fitness and football skills to all pupils who attended. Team building and school ethos became the focus during the last two days of summer school enabling pupils to improve upon their communication skills and form strong bonds with pupils in their form group. We introduced pupils to new and engaging activities, with the aim to build their confidence levels and resilience when working in teams or leading activities. Over the two days, pupils had the opportunity to participate in activities including Wackit Ball, Calatrain and the Lui.

Thank you to all of the Year 7 pupils who attended. It was a fantastic week which has enabled a positive transition for all pupils involved to Lord Derby Academy.

Our LDA community has now been enhanced.
