Year 10 and 11 pupils were invited to a French breakfast where they enjoyed a range of authentic French treats such as pain au chocolat and crêpes.


Mrs Jamieson's classroom was transformed into a Parisian café so pupils could have a relaxing, sociable and enjoyable start to their school day.


