

The biggest & best National Appres



This week at Lord Derby Academy we have celebrated 'National Apprenticeship Week' with pupils taking part in a range of activities to raise awareness. This included watching a variety of videos linking apprenticeships to different subject areas.

Pupils looked at the varying levels of apprenticeship as part of their PSHE and Personal Development Curriculum (PDC) and each level was explained with details of how to find such opportunities and when and where to apply.

Pupils completed the **Apprenticeship Quiz** – a fun quiz that provided information and responses to frequently asked questions.

Questions included (TRUE or FALSE):



An apprenticeship is a real job, and you get paid. Answer: TRUE – An apprenticeship is real job where you learn at the same time, and you are paid. You can do an apprenticeship while you're still in full-time education.

Answer: FALSE - You cannot be in full-time education and do an apprenticeship.

You can still get a degree whilst doing an apprenticeship. Answer: TRUE – Yes, degree apprenticeships allow you to work and study for a degree at the same time.

You can start an apprenticeship at any point in your life, from the age of 16. Answer: TRUE – You can do an apprenticeship from the age of 16. There is no upper age limit for doing an apprenticeship.

Your off-the-job training is in a school while doing an apprenticeship. Answer: FALSE – You study at a college, university, or training provider. This could be classroom based, online, or a mix of both.

All apprenticeships take two years to complete.

Answer: FALSE – An apprenticeship can take anywhere between 1 year up to 6 years, depending on the role and apprenticeship level. All apprenticeships are a minimum of 1 year.

Apprentices have to pay tuition fees for their apprenticeship. Answer: FALSE - The apprenticeship will be paid for by the employer and the government.

You are entitled to holiday leave and other benefits as an apprentice. Answer: TRUE – An apprentice gets the same benefits as any other employee.

Pupils were also directed to <u>Find an apprenticeship (findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk)</u> where they could complete a search of local and national apprenticeship opportunities. Many enjoyed completing the '<u>Which Apprenticeship Am I? Quiz -</u> <u>Amazing Apprenticeships</u>' with some surprising results!

Did you know... There are nearly 600 different apprenticeship standards across England, which cover more than 1700 different job roles!
