




Eurovision 2023

On Thursday 11th May, four of our musicians were lucky enough to attend the Eurovision Song Contest at the M&S Arena in Liverpool City Centre. Pupils were selected for their outstanding attitude to learning in Music as well as their ongoing contribution to performances around school and in the wider community. The trip started with a visit to the Albert Dock to see some of the art installations in place for the event including the giant hearts, floating globe and Soloveiko bird. The Soloveiko birds are Ukraine's national bird and play music representing different areas of the country that Liverpool is hosting the Song Contest on behalf of.

Following this, pupils moved to the waterfront by the Arena to have their lunch where they met a previous UK Eurovision contestant, Nicki French, who represented us in 2000. After this we moved to the Arena itself where pupils were impressed by the exceptional staging. We were then treated to a twohour concert with Music from around Europe with some outstanding lighting and graphic effects. Pupils were particularly impressed by the entries from Belgium and Poland.


