GCSE Music

Year 11 pupils have made an excellent start to their GCSE course this week. Pupils have been exploring the exam board composition briefs which will form 15% of their final grade and are an integral part of their coursework. During Year 10, pupils explored many different composition styles and developed their skills in creating, developing and expanding melodic ideas and accompaniments. They will now be challenged to apply these to specific styles or genres while developing their final coursework. All Year 11 pupils have access to online composition software as well as online revision tools that will support them with their research and preparation for the coursework as well as their final exam which takes place in June. If any pupils require additional support please see Miss Munroe. Pupils should manage their time carefully ensuring that they are preparing fully for the upcoming performance examinations which will start in November as well as their coursework and general revision.

Y7-9 Instrumental Lessons

There are spaces for instrumental lessons this term which are available on a first come, first served basis. Lessons take place during the school day, on a half termly rotation to avoid impact on curriculum subjects. The cost to parents/carers is £20 per term which is payable through MCAS. If you would like your child to take part in these lessons please send a message to Miss Munroe to confirm which instrument they would like to study. If a space is available the charge will be added on MCAS and the pupil informed of the day/time for their lesson. Spaces are currently available across most instruments which includes;

- Trumpet/Trombone (very limited availability)
- Violin (very limited availability)
- Guitar/Ukulele/Bass (very limited availability)

Dance

Year 11 pupils are working incredibly hard in preparation for the year ahead. This term they are researching choreography and will be taking responsibility for their own dance piece in relation to a given stimulus. Pupils will continue to rehearse and practise their solo and trio dances as well as studying in depth a new professional piece of work 'Infra' and 'Shadows'. Within GCSE dance, pupils will study six different set works and learn two set studies. If pupils require any additional resources/help please see Mrs Sunderland.
