

Year 10 Computer Science

Year 10 pupils have been learning all about Algorithms this half term. They have practised creating flowcharts and pseudocode, which are industry standard methods of presenting algorithms. Pupils have enjoyed problem solving in lessons as we continue to build our skills as programmers. All pupils should be using the online resources through Google Classroom to practice their coding 2-3 times a week for 20-30 minutes a time. Year 11 Computer Science


Year 11 pupils have been learning all about Networks this half term. They have covered a lot of content about how data travels across the world wide web and how networks are set up based on their geographical scale. All pupils should be using the online resources through Google Classroom to practice their coding 2-3 times a week for 20-30 minutes a time. They have also been given a number of Seneca homework activities to cover any gaps in their understanding from Year 10. Year 10 Digital Information Technology

Year 10 pupils have been learning about device Interfaces this half term. They have analysed what makes a good interface before starting to research and plan the creation of their own interface as part of their coursework.

<u>Year 11 Business Studies</u>. Year 11 have been learning about product lifecycle and methods used by businesses to extend the life of products. We have used the example of Crocs, who, following a dip in sales in 2008 were able to tap into new markets and the 'ugly fashion' trend to extend the life of their product. Homework tasks for year 11 have included a creative task on extending product life cycle and a revision task to support recall of Unique Selling Points used to promote products and services.



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<u>Year 10 Business Studies</u> Pupils have been learning about the dynamic nature of businesses and looking how new businesses arise. They have also been learning about the role of the entrepreneur and how risks can be reduced. An entrepreneur speaker attended Year 10 pupils studying GCSE Business Studies and gave a talk about the risks involved setting up a new business. He also discussed how entrepreneurial and market research skills are important to have especially when you have a business idea. Pupils were then given a chance to ask questions.



Year 9 Computer Science

Pupils in year 9 have been discovering the potential threats of using the Internet and how cyber security can be dangerous. They have discovered different techniques that hackers may use to gather their information, from social engineering to malware. They will soon be completing an assessment to check how confident they are on keeping themselves safe online.

Year 8 Computer Science

Computer Science pupils in Year 8 have been learning all about how websites are structured using HTML. Creating their very own basic websites on topics that they are interested in! Pupils have practised adding text, images and hyperlinks on websites. The next step for their creations is to style them using CSS to do so.

Year 7 Computer Science

Pupils in Year 7 computer science lessons have been learning all how to become computer literate, being able to use skills such as google classroom and google slides. Soon they will be creating posters on E-Safety to raise awareness of how to be safe online, when using digital devices.
