Here is what we are looking for:

- •It is most important that each word is used correctly according to its definition
- •As many words of the week should be used as possible. Do not simply list the words; we are looking for entries that demonstrate understanding of the vocabulary.
- •Writing should be creative, original and make sense. Entries can be fact or fiction, silly or serious; the most important thing is that new vocabulary is learned and fun is had.
- •Writing must be 50 words or fewer.
- Words of the week should be written in ALL CAPS
- •It is acceptable to use a word in a different tense or to use the plural of a word that is listed in the singular.
