## Dear parent/carer,

As you are aware, Year 11 have now completed 2 series of mock assessments. The first round of mock examinations took place in November and pupils were tested on some aspects of the whole GCSE examination paper. Year 11 were issued with their results from the recent Dean Trust mock examinations last week which tested other elements of the content in the subjects that are included in the English Baccalaureate (EBacc). The purpose of this series was to highlight any gaps in learning that can be addressed in the remaining weeks. An added benefit to this round of assessments was that the majority of examination papers were marked by external examiners. Staff have been spending time in class going through the information and developing strengths and areas for improvement.

These examination results have provided staff with an indication of where each pupil is up to in relation to their knowledge and understanding of that particular course component. With the exception of English Language and mathematics, <u>the other subjects sat examinations in components</u> <u>of the course</u>, <u>not the full course</u>. The table below shows this information. Please be aware that in some subjects the components that were examined were different to the components examined during the November mock examinations.

It is imperative that we work together to ensure our Year 11 pupils are applying themselves fully so that they achieve their potential in the final examinations. This includes getting to school on time and engaging fully in their lessons. Please continue to encourage your child to attend Study Support sessions which run every Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday.

During PSHE lessons Year 11 have been working on their revision timetables and staff have provided information on how to revise. Year 11 should now be in the habit of revising at home. Subject staff are in the process of providing revision lists to help guide pupils through their study plans. If you require any revision resources to support your child, please let us know and we will endeavour to provide them.
